Program Purpose and Design, and Expected Outcomes



Program Purpose

The Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants program aims to:

- Increase the capacity and responsiveness of community colleges to address the skill development needs of employers and dislocated and unemployed workers, incumbent workers, and new entrants to the workforce;
- Offer this spectrum of workers and other individuals accelerated career pathways that enable that enable them to gain skills and transition from unemployment to (re)employment quickly; and
- Address the new challenges associated with the COVID-19 health crisis that necessitate social distancing practices and expanding online and technologyenabled learning and migrating services to a virtual environment.



Program Design

As part of program design, all applicants must design workforce development strategies that incorporate:

- Core Elements:
 - Single institutions must address Core Elements 1-4.
 - Consortium leads must address Core Elements 1-5.
- Results-based design
- Third-party evaluation
- Sustainability plan



Program Design (continued)

Core Elements

- Core Element 1: Evidence-based Design
- Core Element 2: Sector Strategies and Employer Engagement
- Core Element 3: Enhanced Career Pathway Programs and Accelerated Learning Strategies
- Core Element 4: Strategic Alignment with the Workforce Development System
- Core Element 5: Innovative Systems Change. Consortium applicants (only) must propose strategies in one of the following focus areas:
 - Option A: Accelerated Learning Pathways; or
 - Option B: Statewide Data Integration and Use

Single Institution Applicants

- Capacity Building Performance Outcomes. Applicants will specify grant-specific targets for outcomes in three outcomes areas:
 - Sector Strategies and Employer Engagement
 - Enhanced Career Pathway Programs and Accelerated Learning Strategies
 - Strategic Alignment with the Workforce Development System
- Participant Training and Employment Tracking: Applicants will also track and report eight participant outputs/outcomes for a selected cohort of students throughout their grants, using DOL's Workforce Innovation Performance System (WIPS).
- The three capacity-building performance outcomes targets (and the related outputs, milestones, and deliverables in the work plan) form the basis of the Department's assessment of grantee performance.



Expected Outcomes

Consortium Applicants

- Consortium applicants will specify two grant-specific targets within each of the following four outcomes areas, for a total of eight grant-specific targets:
 - Sector Strategies and Employer Engagement
 - Enhanced Career Pathway Programs and Accelerated Learning Strategies
 - Strategic Alignment with the Workforce Development System
 - Innovative Systems Change. Applicants will select the two outcomes under the option for Core Element 5 that they chose for the FOA:

> Accelerated Learning Pathways

Statewide Data Integration and Use

The eight systems change performance outcomes targets (and the related outputs, milestones, and deliverables in the work plan) form the basis of the **Department's assessment of grantee performance.**



Award Information, Eligibility, Partnerships, and Priority Consideration



Award Information

Approximately \$40 million to fund approximately 8-16 grants

- Single institution applicants may apply for a ceiling amount of up to \$2 million
- Consortium lead applicants may apply for a ceiling amount of up to \$5 million
- The minimum for both types of applicants is \$1 million



Eligible Lead Applicants

- The eligible lead applicant must be a community college that is a public institution of higher education (IHE) as defined in Section 101(a) of the Higher Education Act and whose most common degree awarded is an associate degree.
- The lead applicant must apply as one of the following:
 - Single institution lead; or
 - Consortium lead representing a consortium of IHEs.
 - Consortium members may include community colleges and public and private, non-profit four-year IHEs, as defined in section 101(a) of the Higher Education Act.
- Single institution applicants will undertake capacity building at one institution. Consortium applicants will undertake capacity building and systems change within one state, or across one or more community college districts within a state.
- Both single institution and consortium leads must partner with required partners to form an SCC Partnership (see next slide).



The SCC Partnership

- This program will award grants to an SCC partnership of public and private sector entities.
- A single institution applicant's SCC Partnership will be comprised of:
 - Lead applicant;
 - Required workforce development system partner(s);
 - Required employer partners; and
 - Any optional partners.
- A **consortium** applicant's SCC Partnership will be comprised of:
 - IHE consortium members, including the lead applicant;
 - Required IHE coordinating entity;
 - Required workforce development system partner(s);
 - Required employer partners; and
 - Any optional partners



Required Partners

Both consortium and single applicants:

- Workforce Development System: one or more partners from the publicly funded workforce development system; and
- Employer Partners: an industry/trade association or a consortium of at least three employers.
- In addition, consortium applicants (only) must include:
 - IHE Consortium; and
 - Statewide: DOL encourages inclusion of all or a majority of community colleges in a state
 - District-based: all colleges within the district(s), but no less than three colleges across one or more geographically contiguous districts.
 - IHE Coordinating Entity: at least one state-level or community college districtlevel entity that is responsible for regulating, governing, advising, and/or coordinating the IHE in the consortium.

Optional Partners

Optional partners that can support and advance the work of the SCC Partnership include (but are not limited to) the following:

- State Apprenticeship Agencies
- Federally funded programs, such as Adult Education and Perkins
- American Job Center operators
- Economic development agencies
- Labor-management organizations
- Community-based organizations that provide social support and/or wraparound services
- Foundations and philanthropic organizations



Priority Consideration

- Applicants that demonstrate, in their abstract, that at least one census tract within their physical service area is designated by the Secretary of Treasury as a qualified Opportunity Zone will receive two bonus points toward their overall application score.

The Project Narrative is limited to 25 double-spaced singlesided 8.5 x 11 inch pages with Times New Roman 12 point text font and 1-inch margins. You must number the Project Narrative beginning with page number 1.

Evaluated using the evaluation criteria identified in Section V.A

Attachments to the Project Narrative

Section IV.B.4

In addition to the Project Narrative applicants must submit attachments.

- Must be clearly labeled as Attachments.
- Only Attachments listed in Section IV.B.4 of the FOA are excluded from the page limit.
- No additional materials will be considered.
- See Section IV.B.4 for information on valid attachment file names.
