

The first step towards participating in the TAA Program is filing a TAA petition with USDOL.

## WHO MAY FILE A PETITION?

A petition may be filed with USDOL by:

- Two or more workers from the same firm:
- A certified or recognized union or other duly authorized representative of the group of workers; or
- An American Job Center operator or American Job Center partners including state workforce officials, employment security agencies, or dislocated worker unit and rapid response team members.

## **HOW TO APPLY?**

 The Missouri Job Centers can help you file a TAA petition. Please send an email to MissouriTradeAct@dhewd.mo.gov requesting assistance with a TAA petition.

USDOL will investigate information provided in the petition and from the employer to determine if your layoff was due to foreign trade. If it was, USDOL will certify your petition. Disclaimer: Not all petitions that are submitted will be certified.
