Customized Training

Some employers prefer training that uses a combination of classroom instruction with hands-on experience performing the job. The classroom portion of the training may be provided by a local college or other educational institution using input from the employer, or it may be provided directly by the employer. Either way, the Georgia Department of Labor can help defray the total cost of customized training for qualified workers.

Tax Credits

Some applicants may be eligible for the Work Opportunity Tax Credit. Our staff can assist employers in certifying job applicants in order to receive up to a maximum \$9,600 tax credit. Qualifying individuals include, but are not limited to, certain veterans, certain individuals who have received temporary family assistance or food stamps, and some disabled individuals. Federal Bonding

Federal Bonding is a service that offers employers limited liability coverage if they hire job applicants who can't be covered by a commercial bond. Job applicants who have poor credit, have declared bankruptcy, are ex-offenders, and others who are unable to secure employment without bonding services.
